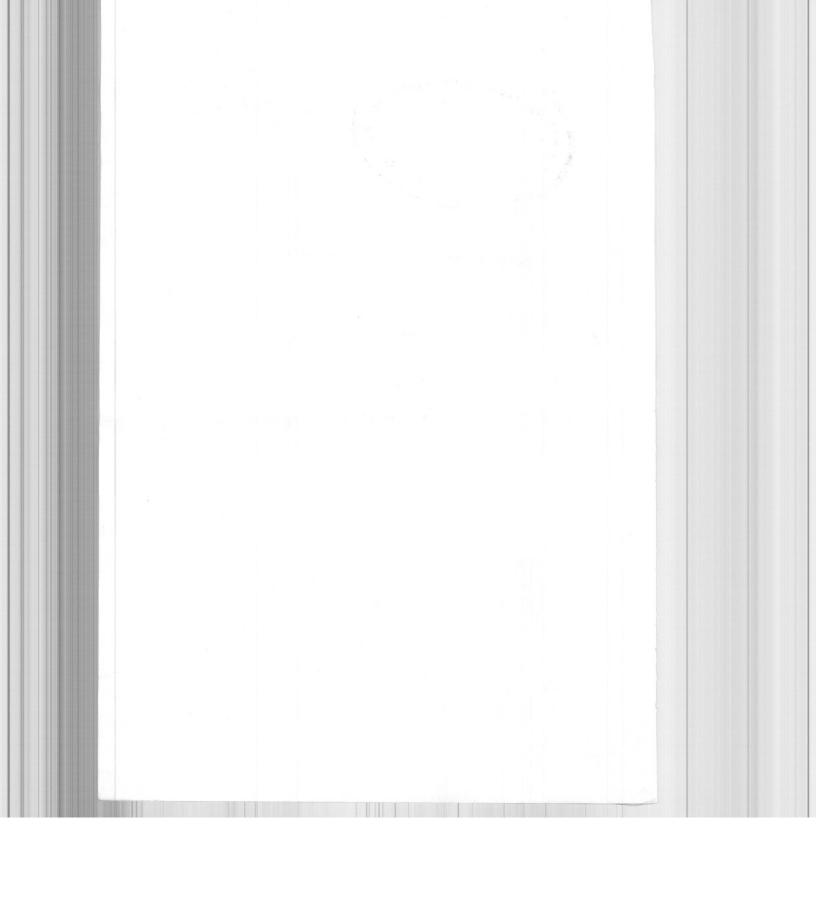

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2001

FINANCIAL RESULTS

The Estate was seriously affected by the frost and dry weather prior to the commencement of the financial year and crop was as a result lower than estimate, although slightly better than last year.

International tea prices improved in the first eight months, but have fallen back significantly subsequently.

Due to the power rationing our manufacturing costs were greatly increased by using our own generators, although some duty refunds were given.

In January this year the Industrial Court finally ruled on the Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Kenya Tea Growers Association awarding increases of 7% for 2000, 5% in 2001 and the required back payments were made that month.

Weather conditions for the first six weeks this year have been useful, however prices remain low, barely above our cost of production.

Your Directors are therefore recommending a final dividend of Shs.2/50 for the year ended 31st March 2001 (1999/2000 - Shs.2/50).

TEA

Factory throughput of 2,873,572 Kgs of made tea was made up as follows :-

Using part of the development loan mentioned last year, we have installed new CTC lines in the Factory and improved quality has been achieved.

SOCIAL CONTRIBUTION

The major points under this heading include:

- There are 1759 workers employed with over 7000 dependants.
- Our foreign currency earnings amounted to the equivalent of K.Shs. 333,650,000 (2000 K.Shs.333,325,000).
- iii) The company paid corporation cax to the Kenya Government of Shs.8,558,000.00 and agricultural produce cess of 3,057,000.00 to the Tea Board of Kenya to be disbursed to the County Council and Tea Roads Cess Committee for maintenance of tea roads in our district.
- iv) Revenue expenditure of Shs.13,969,000 and capital expenditure of Shs.7,112,000.00 was spent on a wide range of health, welfare and educational services and facilities.
- Through the Nandi Branch of the Kenya Tea Growers Association we continue to support the development of the Nandi Hills Primary School and Taito Secondary School.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT (Continued)

ENVIRONMENT

We have regularly lobbied the Authorities and Government to halt the destruction of the forests bordering our operations, which are so vital to maintaining rainfall patterns. Some small progress can be reported.

Within the Estate we continue our planting programme for indigenous trees and bamboo.

In addition, that land which is unsuitable for tea growing is planted with eucalyptus to fuel our driers together with pinus and cypress for pallet making and building requirements.

STAFF

John Kaurra our General Manager for over 20 years retired in December and on behalf of us all I would thank him sincerely for his enormous contribution during those years. We wish him and his wife Margaret a long and happy retirement.

At the same time I would welcome Luke Osire, who takes over the position and wish him every possible success, assuring him of our fullest support.

In addition we must thank those other managers and staff at the Estate for the results achieved.

FUTURE PROSPECTS

While good weather conditions presently prevail we are only one and a half months into our financial year.

In addition, the continuing low international tea price and strong Kenya Shilling will require every possible economic and management control to ensure profitability.

It would be unwise to endeavour to make any accurate forecast of the results for 2001/2002 at this time.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2001

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below:

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with and comply with International Accounting Standards.

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain property, plant and equipment.

REVENUE RECOGNITION

Turnover represents the gross value of tea sold.

INVENTORIES

Unsold tea is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost comprises all estate, factory and packing expenses.

Stores are stated at average purchase cost.

Tea nursery and firewood are stated at production cost.

PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation.

DEPRECIATION

No depreciation is provided on freehold land and tea development expenditure.

Other property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight line basis to write off the cost or valuation over their estimated useful lives.

The annual rates generally in use are:

Buildings	5%
Dams	2.5%
Machinery and equipment	10%
Motor vehicles	10% - 25%
Office equipment, furniture and fittings	10%
Computers	25%

TEA DEVELOPMENT

Tea development represents the cost of establishing mature tea bushes. No provision is made for amortisation as the costs of replanting, infilling and upkeep are charged against revenue and the assets are revalued at periodic intervals.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (Continued)

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

TAXATION

Current taxation is provided on the basis of the results for the year, as shown in the financial statements, adjusted in accordance with tax legislation.

Deferred income tax is provided, using the liability method, for all temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying values for financial reporting purposes. Currently enacted tax rates are used to determine deferred income tax.

The principal temporary differences arise from depreciation on property, plant and equipment, revaluations of certain non-current assets and provisions for gratuity.

PROVISION FOR EMPLOYEE ENTITLEMENTS

Employee entitlements to annual leave are recognised when they accrue to employees. A provision is made for the estimated liability for annual leave accrued at the balance sheet date.

RETIREMENT BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for eligible non-unionisable employees. The scheme is administered by the company and is funded by contributions from both the company and employees. The company's contributions to the defined contribution plan are charged to the income statement in the year to which they relate.

The company also contributes to the statutory National Social Security Fund. This is a defined contribution scheme registered under the National Social Security Act. The company's obligations under the scheme are limited to specific contributions legislated from time to time and are currently limited to Sh 80 per month per employee. The company's contributions are charged to the income statement in the year to which they relate.

Unionisable staff who resign or whose services are terminated on completion of ten years of continuous and meritorious service with the company are entitled to twenty one days pay for each completed year of service by way of gratuity, based on the wages or salary at the time of such resignation or termination of services, as provided for in the trade union agreement with the company. An employee who is dismissed or terminated for gross misconduct is not entitled to gratuity. The service gratuity is provided for in the financial statements as it accrues to each employee.

FOREIGN CURRENCIES

Assets and liabilities expressed in foreign currencies are translated into Kenya Shillings at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions during the year are translated at the rates ruling at the dates of the transactions. Gains and losses on exchange are dealt with in the income statement.

In the normal course of business, the company sells certain of its tea through an associated company which acts as an agent. The associated company charges a commission of 3% on all private sales. The commission paid in the year amounted to Sh 7,520,482 (2000 - Sh 6,427,960).
