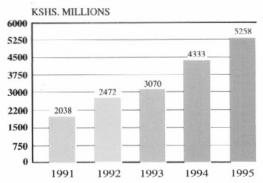
Profit Before Tax

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 1995

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The accounts of the Company and the Group are prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting, modified to include the revaluation of certain assets.

(b) GROUP ACCOUNTS

(i) Subsidiary

The Group Accounts comprise a consolidation of the accounts of the Company and its subsidiary, all of which are made up to 31st December, 1995.

(ii) Associated Companies

The Associated Companies' results have not been consolidated as the Directors are of the opinion that it would involve delay out of proportion to the value to the members of the Company. The disclosure requirements under Kenyan Accounting Standard 12, where the accounts of Associated Companies are not consolidated, are shown under Note 8.

The disclosure requirements under Companies Act are shown under Note 2.

(c) INCOME

(i) Advances

Interest on advances is on accruals basis.

(ii) Finance and Leasing Earnings

Credit is taken in each accounting year for finance charges received and receivable after eliminating from the balance at the conclusion of each such year, the unearned finance charges calculated on a basis such as to allocate charges earned to the appropriate accounting period.

(d) FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation.

Leasehold land and buildings are stated at professional valuation carried out at 31st December, 1995. The basis of valuation is open market value.

Depreciation is provided on straight line basis by reference to the expected useful lives of the assets concerned. The rates used are as follows:

Furniture and equipment 10 - 25
Motor vehicles 25

No depreciation is provided on leasehold land and buildings in view of regular maintenance and confirmation of values by professional valuers.

(e) INVESTMENTS

(i) The Company's quoted investments are shown in the Balance Sheet at their market value. The surplus or deficit arising with reference to the cost price has been dealt with through the Capital Reserves, in accordance with Kenyan Accounting Standard 14.

> The market value of quoted investments is based on the closing middle price of the Stock Exchange quotation as at the date of the Balance Sheet.

(ii) The Company's unquoted investments are stated at cost.

(f) BAD AND DOUBTFUL DEBTS

Advances are stated after deduction of specific provisions. These provisions are made when, in the opinion of the Board, after evaluation of the individual advances, recovery is doubtful.

(g) DEFERRED TAXATION

Provision for deferred tax is made only when the Directors consider that a tax benefit or charge is likely to crystallise in the foreseeable future.

(h) TRANSLATION OF FOREIGN CURRENCIES

Transactions during the year are converted into Kenya Shillings at rates ruling at the transaction dates. Assets and liabilities at the balance sheet date which are expressed in foreign currencies are translated into Kenya Shillings at rates ruling at that date. The resulting differences from conversion and translation are dealt with in the profit and loss account in the year in which they arise.

rotation under Articles No. 93 and 94 of the Company's Articles of Association and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election. Mr. Mahmood Pyarali Manji retires under Article No. 98 as this is the first Annual General Meeting since his appointment and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

In terms of Articles No. 93 and 94 of the Company's Articles of Association Mr. Christopher Henry Malavu (a Director who is over the age of 70 years) is due for retirement by rotation and a Special Notice having been received pursuant to section 142 of the Companies Act (Cap 486) it is proposed that he be re-elected as a Director under Section 186(5) of the said Act.

DIVIDENDS

An interim dividend of 20% on the then Issued and Paid-up Share Capital of Shs. 254.4 million (1994–15% on Shs.169,600,000) was paid on August 31, 1995. It is proposed that a final dividend of 20% on the Issued and Paid-up Share Capital of Shs. 318 million be paid on or about June 21, 1996.

AUDITORS

The Company's Auditors, Messrs Kassim-Lakha Abdulla & Co., being eligible, continue in office in accordance with Section 159(2) of the Companies Act (Cap.486) and Section 24(1) of the Banking Act, 1989.

By Order of the Board Julius N. Kuria (Mr) Company Secretary March 27, 1996 Nairobi were implemented effective July 1, 1995. Group profitability, despite the narrowed margins, increased marginally from Shs. 398.6 million in 1994 to Shs. 401.6 million in 1995.

Based on the financial results achieved during the year your Company paid an interim dividend of 20 per cent on the Paid - up Share Capital of Shs. 254.4 million on August 31, 1995. Your Board is now recommending a final dividend of 20 per cent on the increased Paid - up Share Capital of Shs. 318 million to be paid on or about June 21, 1996, making a total payment of Shs. 114.48 million (1994: Shs. 89.04 million).

As part of the conversion, your Company has invested in additional technical expertise, trained and experienced manpower and information technology systems to maintain its competitive edge. Computerisation of Diamond Trust Bank Uganda Limited and Diamond Trust of Tanzania Limited will be undertaken as soon as the on-going computerisation of your Company is completed.

In 1996, the key factors enumerated above will continue to remain in the forefront of economic management. In this context we welcome the publication of the Policy Framework Paper (PFP) Economic Reforms for 1996-1998 - prepared by the Government in collaboration with the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank. The PFP outlines the development strategy and key economic reforms that the Government plans to implement in the next three years to achieve reduction in poverty and unemployment. His Excellency the President has set up a Presidential Economic Commission. His Excellency will be the Chairman and several prominent personalities from private & public sectors will be members. You will be happy to know that your Managing Director, Mr. M.P. Manji has been appointed a member of this important economic body.

The PFP has detailed a range of strategies, measures and programmes covering, among others, financial sector, privatisation, domestic market liberalisation, acceleration of agricultural growth, infrastructure upgrading and encouragement of private sector in new areas such as energy production. These initiatives are designed to improve the environment for the private sector development and hence should enable your Company to respond to the resultant business opportunities.

Your Board and Management have always pursued a policy of controlled growth with prudence, ensuring that we play our role in the development process. Your Board will continue this policy as we expand into commercial banking this year.

Following the retirement of Mr. N. S. Meruani on September 21, 1995, your Board appointed Mr. M.P. Manji as the Managing Director and Chief Executive of your Company with effect from February 1, 1996.

Once again I wish to express our gratitude to all depositors and borrowers who have continued loyally to support your Company.

I should also like to thank, on your behalf and on behalf of the Board, the Management and Staff without whose dedication, commitment and hard work the Company would not have achieved the level of growth realised over the years.

Finally, I am indebted to my colleagues on the Board for their continued guidance, support and advice which has made it possible for your Company to adhere to its long term objectives.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

our Company achieved a major mile stone in 1995 by converting its legal status from a non-bank financial institution into a commercial bank. This year, the necessary organisational changes and operational procedures are being put in place to ensure smooth and orderly transition into an extensive range of commercial banking activities. These additional financial services and facilities will augment, intensify and develop the existing successful business operations built over the past fifty years.

In my last year's statement I mentioned that a number of key factors would affect business in 1995. These were:

- Stabilisation of the banking sector resulting from the policy reforms,
- · Positive impact of liberalisation,
- Maintaining single digit inflation, low interest rate and achieving target economic growth rate of 5%,
- Judicious and pragmatic management of the political process leading to peaceful elections in 1997,
- The negative impact of unrehabilitated infrastructure, unaddressed unemployment and other social issues.

During 1995 the economy revived as the shilling stabilised and inflation was brought to a reasonable level through the sound management of the liberalisation policies by the monetary authorities. The country's GDP growth was an estimated 5 per cent. The fiscal deficit reduced from over 11 per cent of GDP in 1992/93 to 2.6 per cent in 1994/95.

Banking business was competitive in the course of the year. Margins were narrow as direct and operating costs increased causing our cost of doing business to escalate. We, however, achieved growth in our overall operations. Advances went up from Shs. 4,333 million to Shs. 5,258 million, registering an increase of 21 per cent, while deposits increased from Shs. 5,655 million to Shs. 6,738 million, a growth of 19 per cent, and total assets stood at Shs. 8,194 million as compared to Shs. 7,318 million. We realised significantly reduced revenues on money market operations as the cash ratio reserve requirements
